
Work done during the month of March'22



Shopkeepers Will Now Give Food Coupons Instead Of Coins To Beggars

In a first, shopkeepers in Bhilwara will now give free food coupons to the needy, the beggars, or those living on the streets. In most cases, people end up giving some money which would often be insufficient to buy one complete meal. In order to push more people to enjoy the one rupee meals being served to the Swabhiman Bhoj centres run by Jawahar Foundation, the foundation has tied up with shopkeepers in the area who can buy the food coupons for a rupee each and then, give these out to anyone in need.

Awareness drives will be organised around Indira Market chowk and Railway crossing to encourage more and more people to use the coupon system.

1,80,000 meals have been served to underprivileged kids, the destitute, the old, and anyone who's hungry.

Clothes Donated to the Old from Vastra Bank

The Vastra bank initiative stemmed from the idea of crowdsourcing garments, shoes, clothes, and other daily use stuff that is of little to no use to people and then redistributing them to those in need.

In addition to helping the circular economy, the initiative is now helping the poor enjoy fresh clothing and lead a dignified and a little more comfortable life.

To date, Vastra Bank received 2,800 pieces of clothes as donations and has already distributed 2,500 of those within the poor localities of Rajasthan.
